The endowment fund established with this gift at the SBCC Foundation will support, in perpetuity, the highest needs of the programs and initiatives of all academic disciplines that comprise the SBCC Business Division, which has been re-named the *Jack & Julie Nadel School of Business & Entrepreneurship*.

The lobby of the Business and Communications building has been refurbished to create a student-centric, multipurpose, shared study, incubation and event space featuring visual changes including new furniture, fixtures, and cosmetic updates. The space was designed by Dawn Ziemer of KBZ Architects.
